

# Exporting Records from *Scopus* into *RefWorks*

1. After conducting your search and selecting relevant items, click on the **Output** button.

2. Ensure that the Export radio button is selected under Step 1 of the Output page. Under Step 2, ensure that **RefWorks direct export** appears in the **Export format** pull-down menu. Set the Output to **Complete format**. Click on **Export**.


